We would like to request your assistance in helping us to complete as accurately as possible our anticipated enrolments for 2017. The school is required to provide reliable enrolment projections for 2017 to the Department of Education so that they can determine the appropriate staffing levels for our school for next year. Once this is done, we have time to fill in any teacher vacancies that may result.

All current students are guaranteed a place but we need to know if you actually need that place. We are aware that things can change so your response is not binding, but it will give the school a good indication of possible changes to existing enrolments.

Please advise us of any issues you would like the school to consider for class placement in 2017.

Parents are invited to advise us of any special reasons they would like the school to take into consideration when placing their children in classes for 2017. Please be aware that this is not an invitation to request particular teachers or class structures, but it is an opportunity to advise us of any important concerns that you would like us to consider when placing your child. Parents can be confident their issues will receive full consideration when classes are being formed but the school reserves the right to make the final determination about class placement based on detailed knowledge of all related circumstances.

Please send a separate form for each child as forms are filed as class sets.

Information about applying for Year 7 entry to selective high 2018

What are selective high schools?

Selective high schools cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Who can apply?

Age and school Year

Students are usually in Year 5 at the time of applying (2016) and in Year 6 when sitting the test (2017). They are usually born between 1 January 2005 and 1 August 2006. If you apply when your child is out of the age range or in another school year, selection committees will examine the reasons for this. Selection committees can decide not to accept students who will be in Year 7 in 2017 and are seeking to repeat Year 7 in a selective high school. Selection committees look carefully at youngest students in Year 6 to determine whether there are special requirements that the school can provide. The selective high school principal may need to interview much younger students in Year 6. Students seeking acceleration from Year 5 in 2017 to Year 7 in 2018 must gain results, which place them in the top half of the students offered placement in their selective high school of choice. Selection committees have the discretion to consider whether a student has been advantaged by having done the Selective High School Placement Test in a previous year.

Important Information

- Parents must apply online at <u>www.schools.nsw.edu.au/shsplacement</u> and should read the instructions carefully. You will register to receive a password and then log in to complete the application and submit it. Once you have successfully submitted your application you will receive an email with a copy of your application containing your child's application number. You must quote this number whenever you make enquiries about your application. You should also check the copy of the application details. If you find you have made a mistake after you submitted your application, email the Unit to change any information. Do not apply twice for the same student, as the selection committee can consider only one application for each student. Some email providers such as Gmail will not accept emails with attachments sent from the Unit. If this happens, we have to send all information by mail.
- Applications for entry in 2048 can be made online between 11 October and 14 November 2016
- All Applicants are required to sit a Selective High School Placement Test held on Thursday March 2017

To help with your baking we have a couple of ideas to get you started.

Mini Toffees

Line two 12-cup mini muffin trays with patty cases. Place 500g sugar, 34 cup cold water and 1 tablespoon brown vinegar in a saucepan over medium heat and stir until sugar completely dissolves. Bring to the boil, without stirring, and cook until syrup browns. Remove from heat and cool until bubbles settle. Pour into prepared muffin trays, decorate with sprinkles and set aside to harden.

Chocolate Crackles

In a large bowl, mix 4 cups of Rice Bubbles, 1 cup of icing sugar, 3 tablespoons cocoa and 1 cup of dessicated coconut. Slowly melt 25og chopped copha in a saucepan over low heat. Allow to cool slightly. Add to rice bubble mixture, stirring until well combined. Spoon mixture into paper patty cases and refrigerate until firm.
