Parent Survey (Term 3, 2019)

These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential.

The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October and is available in 23 languages. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.
